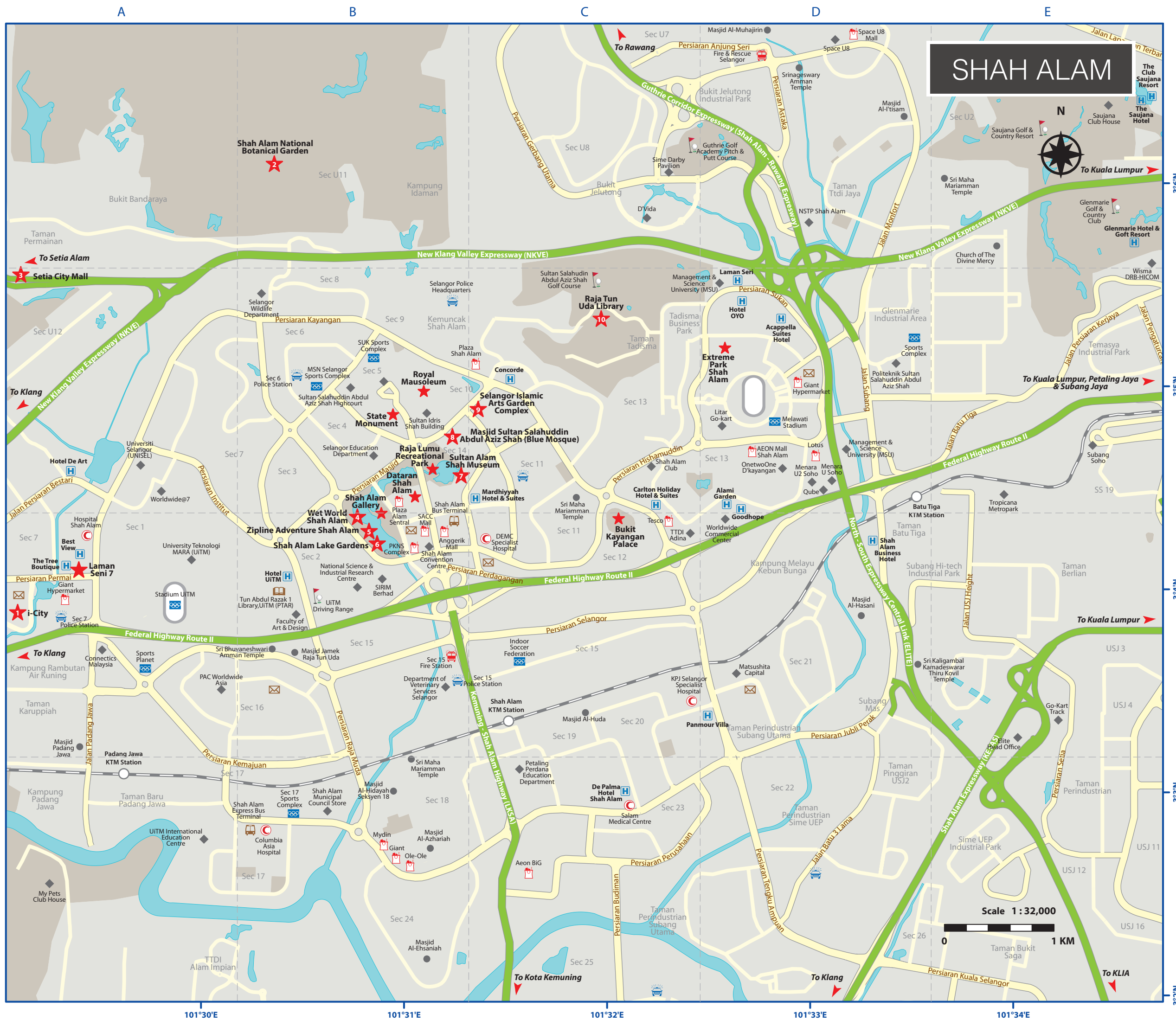

**I-CITY**  
i-City is a unique destination which features a variety of attractions under one roof. It has been dubbed 'The City of Glittering Lights' for its mesmerising nightscape, created by a million LED lights. The highlight here is the 50,000 sq ft SnoWalk, where visitors can experience a simulated AR environment. Other attractions include a Wax Museum, 6D motion theatre, water park and indoor amusement arcade.

**SHAH ALAM NATIONAL BOTANICAL GARDEN**  
Shah Alam National Botanical Garden is an 817-hectare forest park. It comprises a Tropical Fruit Orchard, an Animal Park, a Cactus Garden, Ornamental Garden and many more. One of the most popular attractions here is the Four Seasons Temperate House which allows visitors to experience the different climates at different times of the year. At the Spice and Beverages Garden, visitors can have a closer look at coffee, tea and cinnamon plants. For a longer visit, stay overnight at the village houses styled after Malay traditional homes.

**ZIPLINE ADVENTURE SHAH ALAM**

**SHAH ALAM LAKE GARDENS**  
Sprawled over 43 hectares, Shah Alam Lake Gardens is the city's green lung with shady rainforests, scenic lakes, meandering footpaths and a floating restaurant. Several species of birds such as peacocks and storks are also reared here. This lake gardens is equipped with benches, reflexology paths, jogging trails, cycling trails and a children's playground. **MASJID SULTAN SALAHUDDIN ABDUL AZIZ SHAH (BLUE MOSQUE)**  
Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah Mosque is one of the most impressive landmarks in the state. The mosque is said to be one of the largest in Southeast Asia with the capacity of accommodating 24,000 worshippers at one time. It is popularly known as the 'Blue Mosque' for its gleaming blue dome. The mosque features a combination of traditional Islamic, West Asian, Indian and Malay design elements. Visitors are advised to dress modestly while visiting the mosque.

**SELANGOR ISLAMIC ARTS GARDEN COMPLEX**  
Built on a 14-hectare site, this spiritual sanctuary showcases the splendours of Islamic art. It serves as the exhibition and production centre for Yayasan Restu, a non-profit organisation that aims to revive, preserve and promote Islamic arts. Visitors can watch artists at work as they create intricate works of art relating to Islam and the holy Quran. The complex houses nine galleries, a lecture hall, children's centre and various activity rooms. This complex is situated overlooking the Blue Mosque.

# Selangor

Welcome to Selangor, hailed as the 'Gateway to Malaysia'. Selangor is home to two international airports (KLIA and KLIA2) and Malaysia's largest seaport, Port Klang. The state offers visitors an exciting discovery of fabulous natural wonders, exciting theme parks, shopping malls to never-ending culinary delights from all around Malaysia. Shah Alam, Selangor's capital city is a well planned township. Other urban centres include Petaling Jaya, Subang Jaya, Sunway and the royal town of Klang. Major attractions in the state include the Forest Research Institute of Malaysia (FRIM) and theme parks such as Sunway Lagoon and i-City. Selangor has a scenic hinterland that is dotted with scenic homestay villages, firefly parks, recreational forests and coastal mangroves.

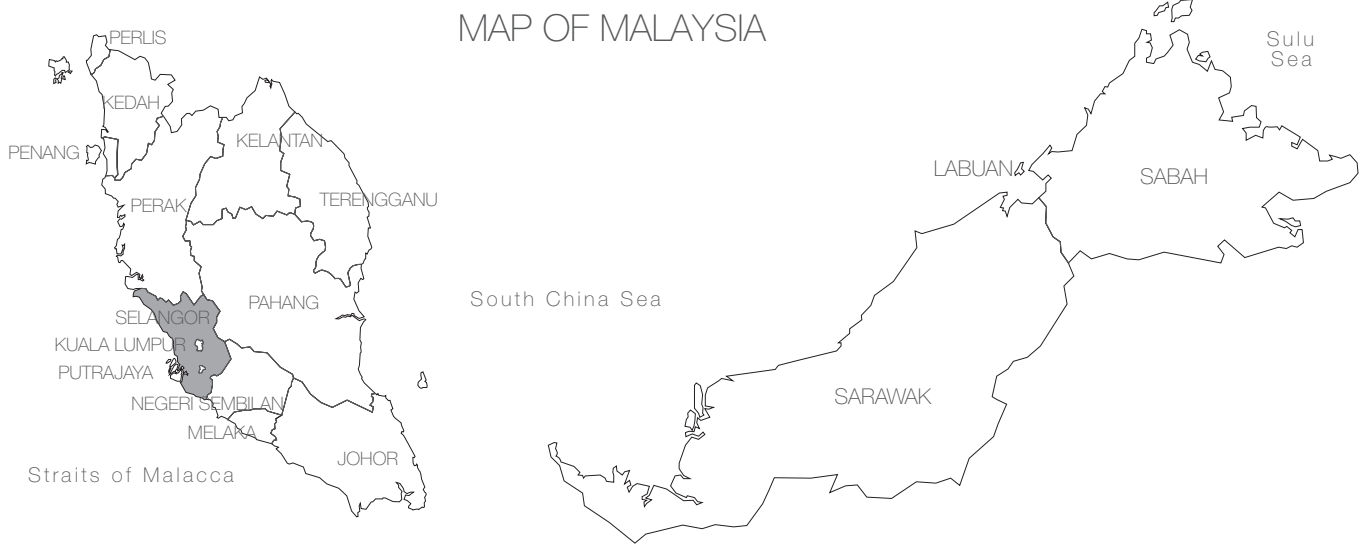
## GETTING THERE

Selangor is the location of the main entry points to Malaysia. The Kuala Lumpur International Airport Terminal 1 (KLIA T1) and Terminal 2 (KLIA T2) are both located in Selangor. Malaysia Airlines, the national carrier, operates from KLIA T1 while KLIA T2 is the hub for low-cost carriers such as AirAsia. The Sultan Abdul Aziz Shah Airport is also located in Selangor. Its SkyPark Terminal serves Firefly, Berjaya Air and private carriers. Batik Air operates from both KLIA and Sultan Abdul Aziz Shah Airport. An excellent network of roads provides easy access to Selangor from any part of the country. Selangor is connected to Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia's capital city, via the Federal Highway and other ring roads. Passengers arriving via the luxury Star Cruises liners disembark at the Pulau Indah Terminal while visitors from Indonesia arrive at the Passenger Cruise Terminal in South Point.

## GETTING AROUND

Getting around Selangor is very convenient as it is linked by buses, taxis and trains. The KTM Komuter train provides access to towns such as Klang, Subang, Batu Caves, Kajang and Shah Alam. Additionally, the RapidKL LRT train connects visitors to places such as Kelana Jaya and Bandar Tasik Selatan.

The RapidKL Mass Rail Transit (MRT) is another fast mode of transport that connects Selangor to its surrounding areas. The 46km-long Kajang Line begins from Kwasa Damansara in Kuala Lumpur and connects passengers to the town of Kajang in Selangor. E-hailing services its another convenient option to get around.



## SHOPPING

Selangor has an abundance of shopping malls and bazaars that will add excitement to your shopping adventure. Explore impressive malls such as the Sunway Pyramid, or have a leisurely shopping experience at The Mines. Malls such as 1 Utama Shopping Centre, IOI, and Central i-City Mall take your shopping experience to a whole new level with its great line-up of high-end labels. For the brand-conscious, you can find branded goods at discounted prices all year round at Mitsui Outlet Park near KLIA. For those on a bargain, GM Wholesale Mall offers great choices at affordable prices.



## DINING

Selangor has a wide variety of local and international fare to tempt all taste buds. The state is famous for its **satay Kajang**, where a variety of these grilled delicacies are available. Selangor's cottage industries offer a variety of snacks such as tapioca chips, banana chips and other local snacks. Try out seafood delights at places such as Pulau Carey and tempting Indian food at Klang.



## HOMESTAYS OF SELANGOR

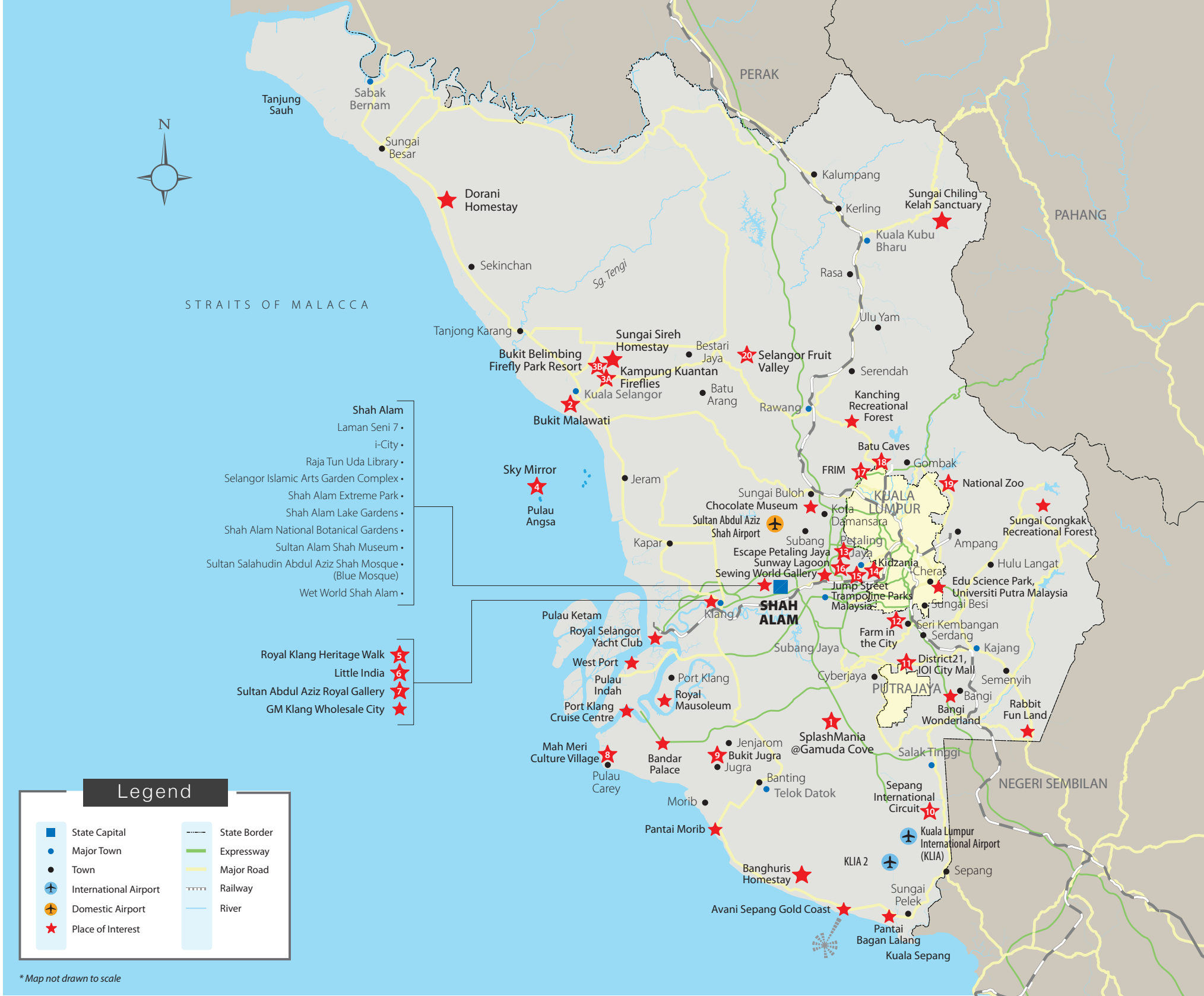

**BUKIT MALAWATI I KUALA SELANGOR**  
Bukit Malawati or Malawati Hill is an important part of the state's history. In the 18th century, the second Sultan of Selangor commissioned the building of Fort Malawati to protect the state. However, Fort Malawati fell to the advancing Dutch forces. This fort continued to be the focal point of many power struggles before it was eventually destroyed during the Selangor Civil War. Visitors can still see the ruins of its original foundation blocks and cannons, a 100-step stairway, an execution slab and a poisoned well.

**FIREFLY PARKS I KUALA SELANGOR**  
Hailed as 'the eighth wonder of the world', the firefly colonies of Kuala Selangor are a rare natural phenomenon. The villages of Kampung Kuantan and Kampung Bukit Belimbing are among the few places in the world where visitors can watch the synchronised flashing of fireflies. Enjoy a ride on a sampan (traditional wooden boat) along the river to watch the spectacular display. Visitors are required to make their bookings in advance.

**SKY MIRROR, PANTAI SASARAN**  
**I KUALA SELANGOR**  
Named after the mirror-like reflection of the sky, Sky Mirror in Kuala Selangor a unique natural attraction that only emerges for several days in a month, on the 1st and 15th of the lunar month as well as four days before and after these dates. A hidden sand bar emerges when the tide is ideal and creates a magical setting for photography enthusiasts. Sasaran Beach is located about 30 minutes' boat ride from Jeram, a coastal fishing village.

**ROYAL KLANG TOWN HERITAGE WALK**  
**I KLANG**  
Said to be the oldest town in Selangor, Klang is characterised by heritage buildings and quaint traditional structures. In the past, Klang was the royal capital of the state and one of the most important tin mining areas in the peninsula. Its heritage quarters can be visited on foot via a heritage walk. There are 18 heritage sites including the Klang Railway Station, Raja Mahadi Fort, a Victorian-style fire station, the Royal Gallery, a church, a Hindu temple and a Buddhist temple.

**LITTLE INDIA I KLANG**  
Said to be the biggest Indian enclave in the country, Little India in Klang is a paradise for shoppers who enjoy browsing through Indian-inspired items. The labyrinth of streets along Jalan Tunku Kelana is lined by shops selling everything from traditional Indian outfits, accessories such as bangles, necklaces and earrings to garlands made of fresh flowers and home decor items. The town takes a festive atmosphere during Indian festivals when shoppers make a beeline to this town.

**SULTAN ABDUL AZIZ ROYAL GALLERY**  
**I KLANG**  
Sultan Abdul Aziz Royal Gallery was established in honour of Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah, who ruled for over 39 years as the Sultan of Selangor and two years as the Yang di-Pertuan Agong. The gallery gives an insight into the rich history and heritage of the Selangor sultanate, with a collection of artefacts, gifts, documents and crown jewels. Sultan Abdul Aziz Royal Gallery is housed in Bangunan Sultan Suleiman, a classic colonial building erected in 1909.

**MAH MERI CULTURAL VILLAGE,**  
**I PULAU CAREY**  
The Mah Meri community is an indigenous community native to Carey Island. Hailed as the 'Masked Men of Malaysia', the community is known for its sculptured masks, created out of a special type of red swamp wood called Nyirih Batu. The Mah Meri community is also famed for its intricate wood carvings of spirit animals. Authentic crafts that are purchased in the Mah Meri Cultural Village bear the UNESCO Seal of Excellence and come with a certificate. Carey Island is also a popular destination for seafood lovers.

**BUKIT JUGRA (JUGRA HILL) I BANTING**  
In days of yore, Jugra Hill was the seat of the state's government. The historical town exudes an old-world charm with stately buildings such as Bandar Palace, Bandar Mosque, Royal Mausoleum and the imposing Sri Jugra Lighthouse at the hilltop. The well-preserved buildings are excellent examples of the artistry and grandeur of the past. Today, Jugra Hill is still very much a popular venue, albeit for a different purpose. Its scenic views and undulating terrain make it a favourite spot for activities such as hiking and paragliding.

**BATU CAVES I GOMBAK**  
Batu Caves is a fascinating cave temple complex situated in a limestone outcrop. It attracts visitors from around the world during the annual Hindu festival of Thaipusam. Consisting several temples, the complex pays homage to Lord Muruga and other Hindu deities. The most interesting part of a visit to Batu Caves is getting to the main temple cave situated atop the hill – by scaling the 272 steps! Rising 140 feet high at the temple grounds is the statue of Lord Muruga.

**ZOO NEGERA (NATIONAL ZOO) I HULU KELANG**  
Sprawled over 110 acres of land, Zoo Negara houses over 400 species of mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians and fish. Attractions include Insect Zoo, Amphibian World, Hornbill Centre, Reptile House, Malaysian Elephants, Bird Aviary, Nocturnal Exhibits, Ape Centre and many more. 90% of the animals are kept in spacious areas with landscaping that resembles their natural habitat. Zoo Negara Malaysia is recognised as the largest zoo in the Malaysian Book of Records. It has also received 10 other recognitions in the field of wildlife breeding.
