

MENARA TINJAU TAMBATAN DIRAJA (OBSERVATION TOWER)

This observation tower is located at Padang Merdeka or Merdeka Square in the centre of Kota Bharu town, along the riverbank. Visitors can make their ascent to the top of the tower. From this vantage point, visitors can enjoy a 360-degree bird's eye view of Kota Bharu.

WAR MUSEUM (BANK KERAPU)

This building was built by Mercantile Bank in 1912. Used by Japanese troops during World War II as a secret police station for war coordination, it continued to function as a bank until 1992, when it was turned into the War Memorial by the Kelantan Museum Corporation.



MASJID MUHAMMADI (MUHAMMADI MOSQUE)

The Muhammadiyah Mosque is the state mosque of Kelantan. It was originally built in wood in 1867 and renovated several times since then. Unique in its architecture, it appeals to both pilgrims and visitors who are interested in its history. The mosque is also famed as a centre for Islamic teachings in Kelantan.

MUSEUM OF ROYAL TRADITIONS AND CUSTOMS (ISTANA JAHAR)

This museum was built in 1887 by Sultan Muhamad, with intricate woodcarvings and elaborate roofs that showcase excellent Kelantanese craftsmanship. The palace has been converted into a museum to share Kelantanese heritage and culture with the world. Here, visitors can learn all about royal births, weddings and other ceremonial occasions.

ROYAL MUSEUM (ISTANA BATU)

The Royal Museum was built in 1989 under the reign of Sultan Ismail I. Formerly the palace of the crown prince, it was donated to the state to be used as a museum. Today, the richly furnished rooms are a lovely repository of Kelantan royal family regalia and the museum disseminates information on the state's royal family, their personal collections and palace decorations.

KAMPUNG KRAFTANGAN (HANDICRAFT VILLAGE AND CRAFT MUSEUM)

Located in the heart of Kota Bharu's cultural zone, the Handicraft Village and Craft Museum provide visitors with the opportunity to see firsthand how the state's famous handicrafts are made. Demonstrations of traditional embroidery, songket weaving, batik printing, silverwork and woodcarving are all carried out by skilled artisans. The Craft Museum houses many fine examples of Kelantanese craftsmanship.

PASAR SITI KHADIJAH (SITI KHADIJAH MARKET)

This market is the economic centre of the community, and a great introduction to the people and cuisine of Kelantan. It is named after Prophet Muhammad's entrepreneurial wife - a fitting name for a market uniquely run by mostly women. It has something for everyone, from fresh produce to traditional crafts and cakes. It is also the place to experience a slice of life in Kelantan, abuzz with the colours, scents and sounds of the local community.

STATE MUSEUM

The State Museum sits in the building which originally housed the Land Office under the British rule. Converted into a museum today, it houses special exhibits such as traditional arts, crafts and musical instruments. There are even artefacts of ceramics from early trading with China.

GELANGGANG SENI (CULTURAL CENTRE)

Located just outside Kota Bharu, this cultural centre is the best place in Kelantan to experience the rich cultural heritage of the state, rarely seen anywhere else in Malaysia. A range of traditional activities are showcased, including bird-singing competitions, wau or giant kite-flying, top spinning, playing of rebana ubi (giant drums) and wayang kulit (shadow puppetry).

WAKAF CHE YEH NIGHT MARKET

This is the largest market in the state, about 4km from Kota Bharu, and quite close to the Thai border. Functioning as a wet and wholesale market during the day, it comes alive at night, with an assortment of local products ranging from fabrics and clothes to food and local fruits. Whether just wandering around and taking in the local colour or haggling with local traders, a visit here is as entertaining as it is eye-opening.

Malaysia

Situated in the heart of Southeast Asia, Malaysia is a vibrant destination with a diversity of cultures and traditions. This tropical paradise boasts pristine jungles and verdant national parks that are teeming with numerous species of birds and wildlife.

Malaysia's sun-drenched islands and beaches are home to a stunning range of marine life. Its natural wealth is complemented by magnificent modern landmarks and heritage buildings. There is something to charm every visitor, be it a history-lover, nature-enthusiast, sun-seeker or an avid shopper. Explore the length and breadth of the country to discover the many attractions of Malaysia!



Kelantan

Kelantanese culture is wonderfully unique, from its delicious cuisine to the distinctive Kelantanese Malay dialect spoken throughout the state. It is also home to some of the most ancient archaeological discoveries in Malaysia, including several prehistoric aboriginal settlements. Acknowledged as the Cradle of Malay Culture, Kelantan is a veritable showcase of traditional Malay customs and art forms, which includes wau (kite-flying) and wayang kulit (shadow puppetry). Kelantanese handicrafts such as batik, kain songket (woven brocade) and silverware are especially fine and sought after.

GT GETTING THERE

Malaysia Airlines, AirAsia, Firefly and Batik Air operate regular flights to Kota Bharu. For those who would like to try out a train journey, Keretapi Tanah Melayu (KTMB) offers a somewhat adventurous journey to several towns such as Gua Musang, Kuala Krai, Tanah Merah, Pasir Mas, Wakaf Bharu and Tumpat. However, passengers must take note that there are no direct train services to Kelantan from Kuala Lumpur. Passengers from Kuala Lumpur will disembark at the Gemas station (in Negeri Sembilan) before boarding the eastbound train to Kelantan. Tickets for both trains (KL – Gemas and Gemas – Kelantan) can be purchased in advance. Check the KTMB website at <https://www.ktmb.com.my> for details. Travelling by road is an easy option with the availability of frequent and direct bus services to many towns around Kelantan. Passengers from Kuala Lumpur can board their buses from Terminal Bersepadu Selatan (TBS in short) located at Bandar Tasik Selatan.

GA GETTING AROUND

In Kota Bharu itself, trishaws are an interesting way to explore the city. Kota Bharu Bus Station, situated at the town centre near Pasar Siti Khadijah, provides connectivity to various places within Kota Bharu. To venture outside of Kota Bharu, travellers can take buses from the Lembah Sireh Bus Terminal. The local train is another interesting way to get around in Kelantan. The train operates from Tumpat in the north to Gua Musang in the south.



S SHOPPING

A bewildering range of handicrafts in various colours, shapes and sizes fill the shelves at Kelantan's souvenir shops. Take your pick from the intricate handicrafts, silverware, fashionable batik sarongs, pareos and trendy bags to the richly-embroidered songket fabric and many more. In many places, visitors can also watch how the crafts are made. Some items such as wau (giant kites) can be custom-made to suit your liking. Duty-free shopping zones are available at Rantau Panjang, Pengkalan Kubor and Bukit Bunga. There are modern shopping centres such as KB Mall, Mydin Tunjong Hypermarket, Tesco and AEON Mall.



D DINING

There is a delightful assortment of local fare and most eateries are open until late at night to cater to the adventurous foodies. Rice, the staple food, is creatively cooked in many ways with the use of different herbs and spices. Local dishes are spicy and pungent and some dishes have Thai influences. The state is also known for its variety of sumptuous desserts. Alternatively, visitors can opt for Western food served at major restaurants and hotels. Fast food outlets are available in major towns.


RANTAU PANJANG DUTY-FREE ZONE
In this major border crossing on the Malaysia - Thai boundary, about 40km from Kota Bharu, is a duty-free zone that's extremely popular with shoppers. All kinds of merchandise are available, including clothes, shoes, homeware and food. Little cafes and stalls are great places to take a break for a cold drink or snack.

PENKALAN KUBOR DUTY-FREE ZONE
Also located on the Malaysia-Thai border, this duty-free zone is the place to go for a wide variety of t-shirts, souvenirs, household items and more. Unlike air-conditioned malls or exclusive duty-free shops at the airport, these are open-air stalls where visitors can immerse themselves in the local style of shopping and haggle for the best prices.

RECLINING BUDDHA TEMPLE (WAT PHOTIVIHAN)
This is a Thai Buddhist temple in the town of Tumpat, approximately 15km from Kota Bharu, that houses the largest reclining statue of Buddha (or Sleeping Buddha) in Malaysia. This 40m statue was constructed in 1973 with donations from various Buddhist associations in Malaysia and Thailand.

MUZIUM WAU KELANTAN (KELANTAN KITE MUSEUM)
The wau or traditional kite museum at Pantai Sri Tujuh is a complete showcase of kite culture, providing information on the history and development of these giant kites. The museum has displays of the various types of kites, and also teaches visitors about the age-old traditions in Kelantan and other states in Malaysia, as well as traditional kites from around the world.

SITTING BUDDHA TEMPLE (WAT MACHIMMARAM)
Tumpat is the site of most of the state's Buddhist temples. The Wat Machimmarani houses a large Seated Buddha (or Sitting Buddha) that is 30m high and 18m wide, reputedly the largest in Southeast Asia. It is a popular pilgrimage destination for Buddhist devotees, especially during festive and auspicious days.

PANTAI CAHYA BULAN
Just 10km from Kota Bharu, Pantai Cahaya Bulan is a particularly beautiful stretch of white sandy beach that is popular for family outings and picnics. It also has a variety of water sports including parasailing and canoeing, as well as horse riding. Food stalls and restaurants are dotted along the beach, offering fresh barbecued seafood.

PANTAI IRAMA
This beach in Bachok, about 25km from Kota Bharu, got its name from the gently hushing sound of the sea breeze. Commonly known to be the most beautiful beach in Kelantan, it is a popular spot for families. Water sports are readily available, as are restaurants and barbecue facilities.

GUA IKAN, GUA BATU SUSUN AND GUA KERIS
These three caves can be accessed via long-tailed boats along the Galas River. Gua Ikan or Fish Cave is named after a solitary fish-shaped rock. It is a fascinating experience for naturalists, with a huge chamber of beautifully sculpted stalactites and stalagmites as well as resident bats. The other two caves have smaller passageways and more intricate routes, presenting greater challenges.

DRAGON BOAT TEMPLE (WAT MAI SUVANKHIRI)
Located in Tumpat and spread over an area of four hectares, this breathtakingly beautiful complex consists of two temples. The main temple houses a replica of a dragon that is about 45m in length, thus earning it its name Dragon Boat Temple. The temple has a distinctly Thai architectural design.

MASJID AR-RAHMAN, PULAU GAJAH
Situated about 16km from Kota Bharu, this mosque boasts a unique wooden architecture. It combines elements from various countries such as pillars made out of palm trees from the Middle East, entranceways from Yemen and a Quranic drawing from Turkey. The drums and khat drawings are from Indonesia. Sprawling over 5,000 sq. ft, the mosque can accommodate up to 1,000 worshippers at one time.

KUALA KOH NATIONAL PARK
Taman Negara is Malaysia's premier and largest national park that is spread over the three states of Pahang, Kelantan and Terengganu. Sprawling over 1,013 sq km, the National Park in Kuala Koh makes up 24% of the total park area. Numerous trails and treks are a great way to get to know the surroundings. Other activities include tubing, rafting, birdwatching and more.

KAMPUNG LAUT HERITAGE AREA, TUMPAT
Built in the 18th century, Kampung Laut Mosque is hailed as one of the oldest mosques in Southeast Asia. It stands as a landmark for its historical value and unique archaeological features, particularly its wooden structure that was built without the use of nails. In the past, the mosque was prone to floods due to its location by the riverbank. It survived two major floods, the first in 1926 and another in 1966. To preserve and safeguard the structure, the mosque was relocated to Nilam Puri which lies about 20km away. Now, the mosque has been restored and relocated to its original location in Tumpat. History buffs can view original artefacts such as 'beduk' (drum) and 'mimbar' (pulpit).

SUNGAI NENGGIRI AND GUA CHA
The Nenggiri River offers opportunities for Grade 1 – 2 whitewater rafting while taking in the spectacular scenery and occasional wildlife. Gua Cha is the largest rock shelter along the river valley, housing Neolithic remains dating 5,000 to 9,000 years back, including well-made stone tools, pottery, shell necklaces and stone bracelets.
