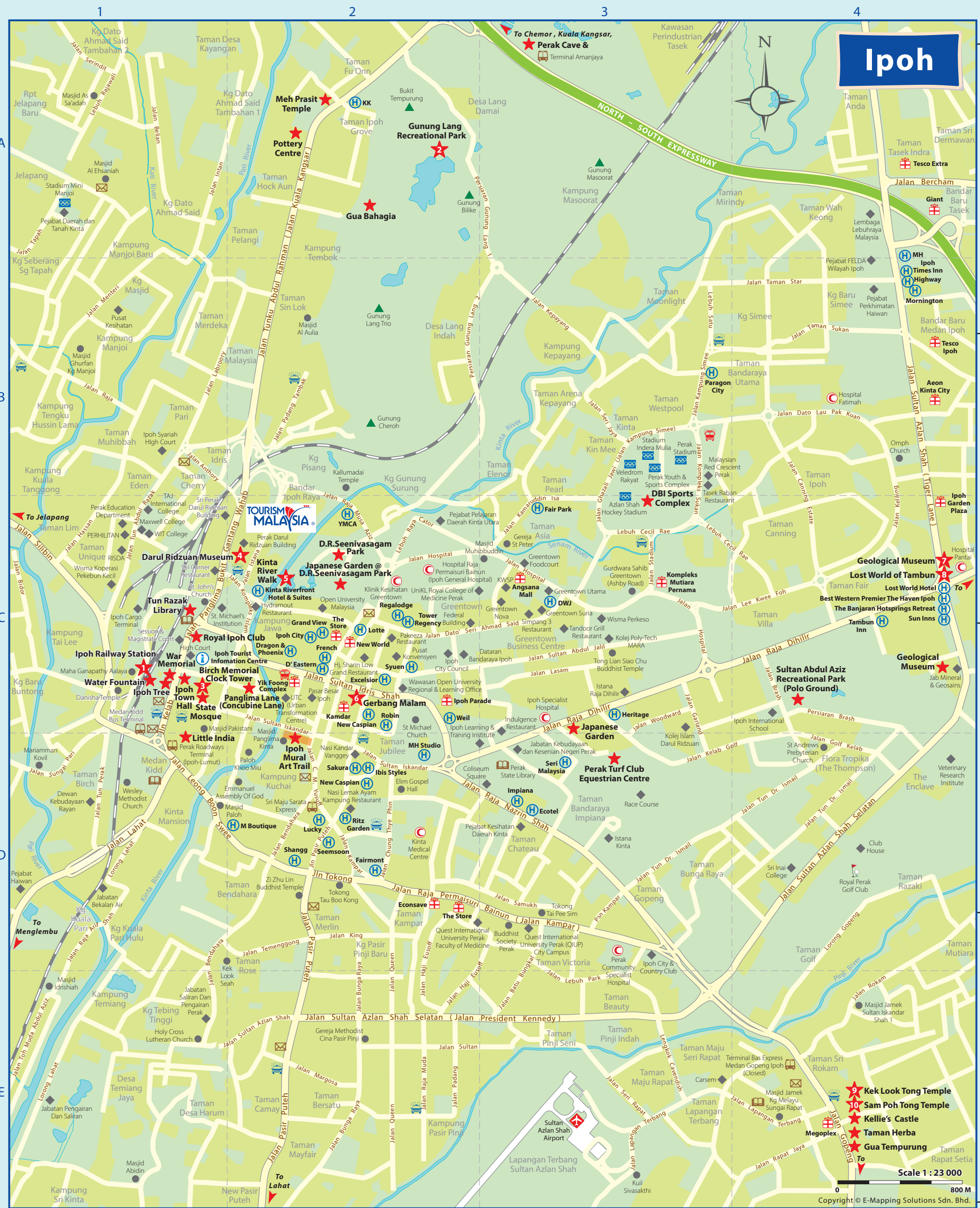

## Places of Interest



### IPOH RAILWAY STATION

Often referred to as the Taj Mahal of Ipoh, Ipoh Railway Station was designed by a British architect, A. B. Hubback, who had also designed the infamous Kuala Lumpur Railway Station. Its stunning Moorish architecture is a major landmark in Perak's capital city. Adjacent to the train station is a hotel.

### GUNUNG LANG RECREATIONAL PARK

Set against the spectacular backdrop of the limestone outcrops of Gunung Lang, this recreational park provides a relaxing getaway for busy city folks. Comprising scenic artificial lakes and landscaped gardens, the park also features a man-made waterfall, lookout towers, campsites, a mini zoo and a playground.

### BIRCH MEMORIAL CLOCK TOWER

Built in 1909, this clock tower was erected in memory of J. W. W. Birch, the first British Resident of Perak who was assassinated in 1875. The panels portray 44 famous figures in world history. Terracotta figures representing the Virtues of British Administration – Loyalty, Patience, Justice and Fortitude – guard the corners of the belfry.

### DARUL RIDZUAN MUSEUM

Housed in a building built more than 80 years ago, this museum contains an interesting collection of artefacts related to the state's tin-mining industry. It also has a sizeable collection on forestry and agriculture. Browse through the museum's exhibits for a glimpse of Perak's early history.

### KINTA RIVER WALK

Often referred to as the mini i-City of Ipoh, Kinta River Walk is the perfect place for a relaxing evening stroll. Rows of trees adorned with multi-coloured LED lights – reminiscent of the ones in Shah Alam – line the riverbank, painting a pretty picture at night. Restaurants can also be found along the river, adding to the lively atmosphere.

### GERBANG MALAM

Located at Jalan Tahwil Azhar, Gerbang Malam is Ipoh's most lively night market. ### KEK LOOK TONG TEMPLE

The Kek Look Tong Temple is one of the most visited temples in Perak. Set among towering limestone outcrops behind Gunung Rapat, the temple features a striking natural interior comprising stalactites, stalagmites and various rock formations. Bronze statues of Buddha reside within its cool and peaceful cavity.

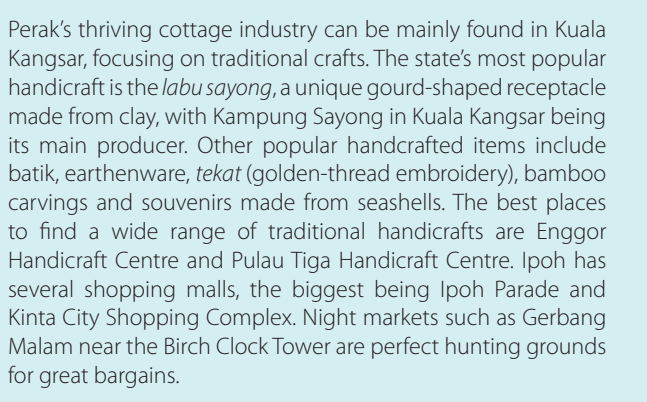

## Dining

Ipoh is a well-known centre for Chinese cuisine. The popular ones include Sar Hor Fun, Hor Hee, Dim Sum and Hainanese Chicken Rice. Rendang Tok, a Malay dish unique to Perak, is also popular. The best places to sample Perak's local specialties are Golden Point Food Court, Tasik Raban, MBI Terrace, Stadium Food Court, Leaning Tower Food Court and Woolley Food City. Other local favourites include Menglembu groundnuts, kacang Putih Buntong, Tambun pomelos, Tanjung Malim Pau (Chinese steamed buns), Kampar Chicken Biscuits and the hugely popular Ipoh White Coffee.



## Getting Here

Ipoh is situated about 165km from Penang and 205km or approximately 1½ hours' drive from Kuala Lumpur. Air-conditioned shuttle services from KLIA to Ipoh are available, as well as bus services from Pudu Sentral and Hentian Duta in KL and Butterworth in Penang. Keretapi Tanah Melayu Berhad (KTMB) provides rail services to all major towns in Perak, namely Sungkai, Batu Gajah, Ipoh, Kuala Kangsar and Taiping. High-speed Electric Train Services (ETS) also provides daily services between KL Sentral and Ipoh.

## Getting Around

Buses and taxis are readily available around Ipoh. Taxis can be found at the city's bus stations, hotels and shopping complexes. To reach other towns in Perak, outstation buses are available at Amanjaya Bus Terminal in Ipoh. Alternatively, you can also rent a car and explore the state at your own pace.

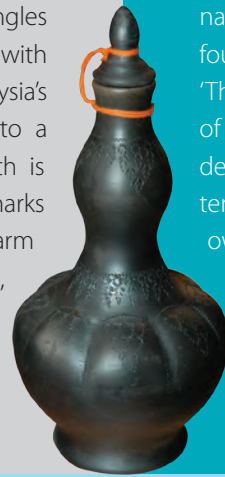

# MALAYSIA

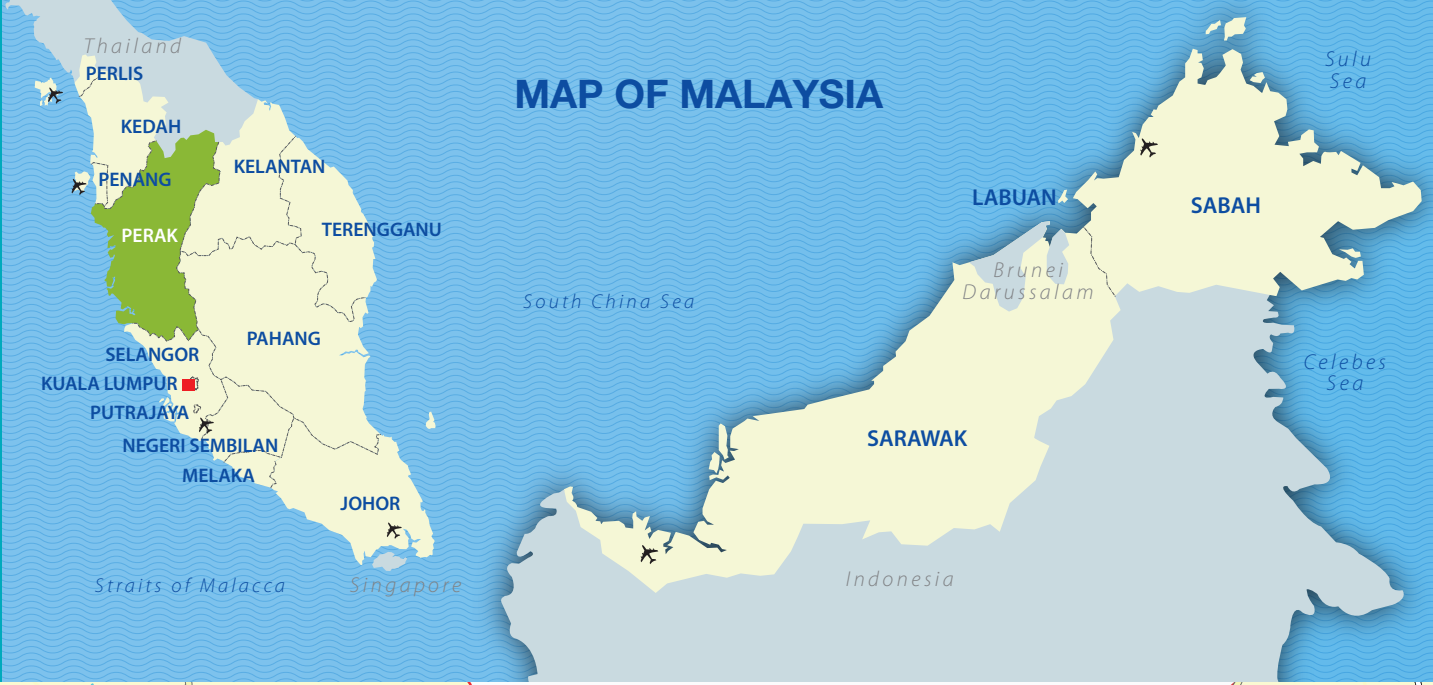

## Perak

### PULAU PANGKOR

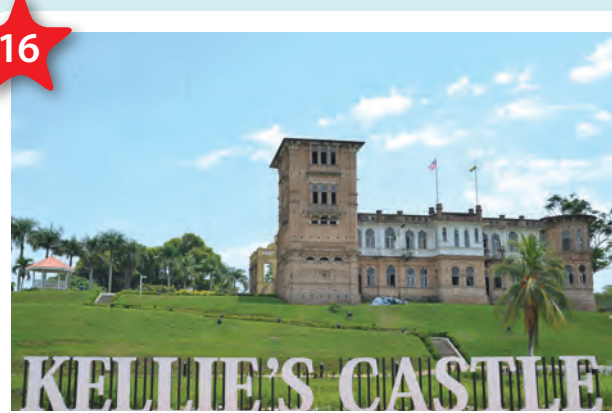


### PERAK MUSEUM

### KELLIE'S CASTLE

Projecting an aura of mystery, Kellie's Castle is the unfinished residence of a wealthy Scottish planter, William Kellie Smith. The mansion's construction was abandoned upon his sudden demise in 1926. The castle is believed to contain hidden rooms and secret underground passages, as well as the location of several tales of the supernatural.

### KUALA GULA BIRD SANCTUARY

Forming part of the Matang Mangrove Forest Reserve, Kuala Gula is a small yet scenic fishing village in Kerian, approximately 50km to the west of Taiping. ### BUKIT LARUT (MAXWELL HILL)

Bukit Larut, once known as Maxwell Hill, is Malaysia's smallest hill resort. Perched 1,250m above sea level, it towers over the scenic town of Taiping. Its virtually undisturbed montane forest was gazetted as a permanent forest reserve in 1910 and houses a bountiful collection of flora and fauna.

### MASJID UBUDIAH

Masjid Ubudiah is one of Kuala Kangsar's most beautiful historical landmarks. Built between 1913 and 1917 by the 28th ruler of Perak, Sultan Idris Mursyidul Adzam Shah, its magnificent golden domes and minarets are the hallmarks of classic Islamic architecture.

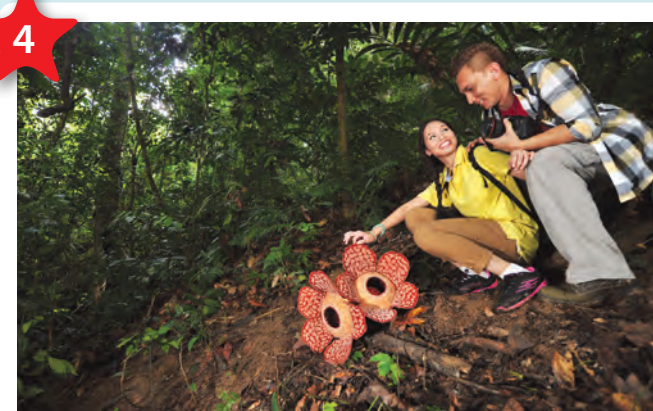

### GUA TEMPURUNG

Stretching over one kilometre from Sungai Siput to Kuala Dipang, Gua Tempurung is one of the largest limestone caves in Peninsular Malaysia. This magnificent show cave is made up of five domes with coconut shell-like ceilings and contains a wealth of natural beauty which includes stalactites, stalagmites and impressive rock formations.

### ROYAL BELUM

Nestled within the protected Belum Valley, Royal Belum's unspoilt wilderness possesses a complex ecosystem and is one of the few places in Malaysia where one can find the rare Rafflesia. It is also an important habitat for a number of endangered species such as the seladang, the Asian Elephant, the Malayan Tiger and the Sumatran Rhinoceros.

### TAIPING LAKE GARDEN

Taiping Lake Garden is one of the country's oldest parks. Established in 1880, what was once a mining ground has been transformed into a beautiful, refreshing sanctuary where a number of flora and fauna species thrive in. ### PASIR SALAK HISTORICAL COMPLEX

The Pasir Salak Historical Complex is a tribute to the Malay warriors of yesteryears who had rebelled against the British rule thus inspiring nationalism. 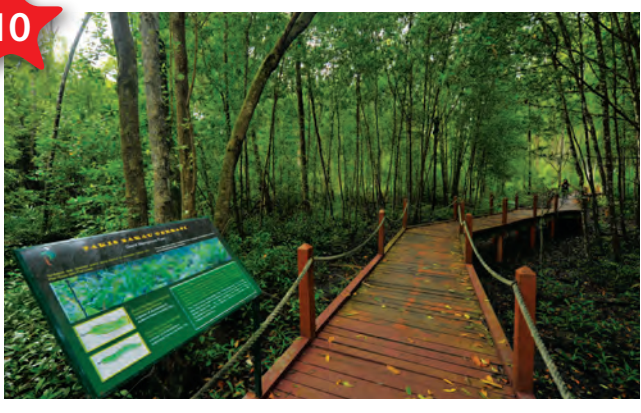

### LENGGONG ARCHAEOLOGICAL GALLERY

Named a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2012, Lenggong Valley is one of the world's most important archaeological sites. One of its many prehistoric caves was the burial site of the infamous Perak Man. ### TELUK INTAN LEANING TOWER

Standing at a height of 25.5m, the pride of Teluk Intan was originally built in 1885 as a covered water tank to store water during dry seasons. It was straight when it was first built, but began to tilt to the left in 1889. Today, the eighty-storey pagoda-like structure is an official national monument.

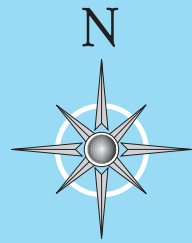
